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GETTING TO GOAL: A MULTIDISCIPLINARY APPROACH TO PHOSPHORUS MANAGEMENT

TARGET AUDIENCE

This educational activity is designed for pharmacists, physicians, nurses, dietitians, patient care technicians and social workers who care for people with CKD.



LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Participants will:

- Explain bone and mineral abnormalities in CKD and their impact on morbidity and mortality
 - Identify the mechanisms, risks, and prevalence of abnormal bone and mineral metabolism in CKD
 - Describe the potential patient outcome benefits of, and strategies for, achieving the K/DOQI recommended calcium, phosphorus, and PTH targets
 - Describe the roles of health care team members in CKD bone management
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- Explain how to apply the K/DOQI guidelines to problem-solve patient-based case studies
 - Identify resources for treatment and education about CKD.
