Programs and Services

Kidney Screening

The **Indiana Kidney Check**, NKFI's free kidney screening that is open to anyone 18 and older, has been instrumental in assisting the foundation in creating awareness on the prevention of kidney disease. NKFI screened 840 participants in the 8 screenings.



Thanks to the Kidney MAPS Students (Mentoring and Assessment Program for Students) IUSOM chapter, for partnering with the Indiana Kidney Check. The program was able to screen more patients and follow up with patients who may need more information about results.

The program is offered throughout the state and participants receive results at the screening.

The screening is recommended for those with one of the risks for kidney disease:

- diabetes or pre-diabetes
- 60 years and older
- certain ethnic groups (including African Americans, Hispanics, Asians, American Indians and Pacific Islanders)
- high blood pressure or pre-hypertension
- family history of kidney disease

High blood pressure and diabetes are the two leading causes of kidney disease.

Kidney Assessment



The **KHRA (Kidney Risk Health Assessment)** is a free check-up held at all Kidney Walks and some health fairs. Participants answer a brief health risk survey and have their height, weight and blood pressure measured. A medical professional is on-site to review results.

Education Program

The NKFI presented a new education program, **Your Kidneys and You**, developed to raise awareness among the general public and individuals at risk for kidney disease. The NKFI collaborated with schools of nursing and trained volunteers to implement presentations to a variety of groups.

The presentation covers:

- what kidneys do
- what kidney disease is
- who is at risk
- why your kidneys are so important to your health
- actions you can take to protect your kidneys

Kidney Camp

The tenth annual **Kidney Camp** was held in June at the YMCA Camp Tecumseh in Brookston, Indiana. The camp is for children, ages 8-18 who are on dialysis, have a kidney transplant or chronic kidney disease. Forty campers attended from around the state, along with a number of caring and dedicated volunteers, including nurses who oversaw all medical needs.

Camp activities were themed around *“The Tenth Anniversary for Kidney Camp.”* Special events included a carnival with games and prizes, field games, and the “Bug Guy” from Purdue University. The campers also participated in events like; swimming, zip-lining, canoeing, archery and tennis.

Team Indiana

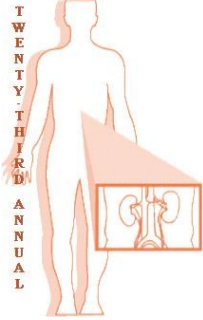


Team Indiana is a group of transplant recipients, donor families, living donors and supporters from Indiana.

Stuart A Kleit Symposium

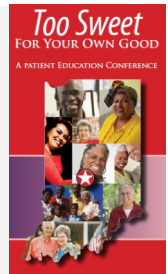

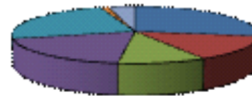
