National Kidney Foundation to honor Cherry Hill Resident at Annual Kidney Ball Jeffrey S. Berns, MD, honored for local and national work with kidney patients

Philadelphia, PA – February 11, 2015 – On Saturday, March 14th, Cherry Hill resident Jeffrey S. Berns, MD, will be honored by the National Kidney Foundation (NKF) at the 31st Annual Kidney Ball at Vie in Philadelphia.

Dr. Berns is currently Professor of Medicine and Pediatrics at the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania, where he is Associate Chief of the Renal, Electrolyte, and Hypertension Division, Director of the Nephrology Fellowship Training Program, and Associate Dean for Graduate Medical Education. In 2014, Berns was appointed as the President of the National Kidney Foundation.

"I have had the tremendous and incredibly rewarding privilege of helping to care for many patients with kidney disease during the last 25 years that I have been practicing in Philadelphia.
