Joseph M. Krainin, M.D. Memorial Young Investigator Award Research Support in Renal Disease and Related Basic Sciences

Grants-in-aid are available for the support of investigation designed to expand the knowledge base of renal disease and its treatment. Preference is given to investigators with novel or original approaches to unsolved problems. The NKF/NCA is particularly interested in funding clinical research. Specific encouragement is also given to investigators in an early stage of their careers.

These grants are funded by money raised locally by the NKF/NCA and are intended for research conducted in the Washington, DC metropolitan area. The grants are made to local institutions in direct support of particular investigators for specific research programs. The principal investigator must have an appointment at the institution receiving the grant. Personal salary for investigators with faculty appointments, for trainees, or for fully salaried faculty at any institution is not permitted.

PLEASE NOTE: You must use the standard National Kidney Foundation application form.

ELIGIBILITY:

- A young investigator must be less than age 42 at time of initiating study, or is within seven (7) years of completion of fellowship/specialty training, and the academic rank must be assistant professor or instructor. If you are a Young Investigator and have not established a record of independent research, you are strongly encouraged to include a letter from an individual who is knowledgeable about your research activities.
- Young investigators must have a M.D. or Ph.D. and hold a faculty appointment in an institution in the Washington, DC area.
 - *Trainees may apply for a grant-in-aid however, by the time the person begins the grant, he/she must send a letter stating that he/she is holding a faculty appointment at the institution where the award is made.*
- Allied health professionals, not in trainee status, may apply and need not have a terminal degree or a faculty appointment at the institution to which the grant is made.

Duration of Award:

1 year projects
2 years projects

Size of Award:

1 year = up to \$25,000
2 years = up to \$50,000
(15% overhead included)
